Meridian RV Resort has some full hook-up sites together, but they will not hold them for us. If you are interested in going you should call and make your reservation ASAP as February is a busy time there and these sites will go fast. Several members have already reserved a site.

Call the resort to reserve a site; do not make a reservation online because you cannot choose your site that way. Their phone number is 480-474-8900, option 4, and the time to call is from 10 am—2 pm Monday through Friday. They are closed on the weekends. When you call between these hours you will talk to the on-site office which is what you want. Cost is \$67 per night including taxes. No need to mention Roadrunners, you reserve your sites individually.

Schultz is in site 42 and Grayson is in 43. The other sites available as of this writing were 48 and 49 and 54-60. You can view the resort map on their website [Encore Meridian | RV Resorts in Arizona](#). All sites are back-in and if you are pulling a trailer your back-up parking skills will definitely be tested.

As far as things to do, there is plenty:

- Mesa Market (the largest flea market in the state) open Friday, Saturday, and Sunday
- Dolly's Steamboat touring Canyon Lake
- Tortilla Flat (small town near Canyon Lake)  
Good food and tourist stuff.
- Goldfield Ghost Town (interesting but a tourist trap)
- Bryce Thompson Arboretum near Superior (kind of far but interesting if you are into those things)

**Las Cruces & Silver City, NM**  
**March 16-23, 2026**

Las Cruces is about 500 miles from Prescott. It is close to White Sands National Park, War Eagles Air Museum and International Space Hall of Fame. We will spend four nights at Hacienda RV Resort. With our discount the rate will be about \$60/night. The campground is holding eight (8) sites until December 1 for our group. You need to call the campground at 575-528-5800 before December 1 and tell them you are with the Yavapai Roadrunners so they put you with our group. There is a one-night deposit required. We will have lunch one day in the Old Mesilla. Stay tuned for other activities.

Silver City is an old mining town 111 miles from Las Cruces. We will spend three nights at Rose Valley RV Ranch. They have set aside eight (8) back in sites close to the barn that we can use for gatherings. With our discount the rate will be about \$40/night. They will hold the sites until the beginning of March. When you call the campground at 575-534-4277 tell them you are with the Yavapai Roadrunners so they will put you in one of our sites. There is a one-night deposit required. Stay tuned for activities.
